WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

38 PUBLIC SESSION

Hound Green Party on the Green David Ashworth attended to discuss the village party planned for 10 August. Citing the locally organised Coronation party as the most recent event on Hound Green; keen to promote more local engagement.

The Chairman confirmed all engagement and activities to promote community spirit greatly welcomed by the Parish Council. Engagement with the Parish Council is much appreciated; more Councillors also very welcome; currently looking for new members. Re the 10th August party

- i Initial plan to have picnic, games, table tennis
- ii Garage owner subsequently offered to provide a BBQ
- iii Also suggestion for local owners of classic cars to display these on the Green.

Discussion

- Parish Council needs to ask questions re safety which has to be top priority. Re the BBQ, permission for one central BBQ, monitored by organisers with appointed safety marshal. To confirm no separate individual BBQs to be lit.
- Question as to whether a gas or charcoal BBQ was to be provided? Gas preferable if dry ground conditions continue. Appreciate likely some rain before August; to ensure water and fire extinguishes to hand; to wet the ground in vicinity of BBQ if needed; to review if very dry hot weather persists.
- Classic cars brought on the Green for display are responsibility of owners and at owners' risk. To be driven on Green only to and from allocated parking area.

Previous events noted – The Jubilee party at Hazeley Bottom; also the Games parties organised by Leonard Crane held on the Green pre-Covid.

Question as to how the event is to be advertised other than via whatsapp; to put on Mattingley Matters facebook and make use of Noticeboard on the Green.

Phone box – A suggestion that some Hound Green residents would like to see a 'Telephone' sign in one of the top panels, as original.

Confirmed that – of the original header signs – the one remaining is chipped and the lettering faded. It would stand out unfavourably with all the other being new. Could have another replacement made but the panels at the top are recently glued in – would be a palaver to get one out.

Priority is getting the job finished and the defibrillator installed. Can then consider; perhaps to display inside?

David left the meeting with the thanks of the Parish Council.

- **39 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING** of 16 June agreed and signed.
- **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST** in items on the Agenda, none.
- **COUNTY COUNCILLOR REPORT** Cllr Tim Davies confirmed there will be County elections this coming May. So County Councillors will be in post for just one year; they may go on to stand for the Shadow Unitary Councils elections scheduled for May 2027.

Re Local Government Reorganisation, all proposals continue to show the Isle of Wight as a separate Unitary. It is obviously uniquely positioned but concerns are raised re its ability to fund its services.

Supply head fitted within the Cabinet; a new length of power cable brought down the pole, through the duct laid when the trench dug and emerging through the phone box base, and so into the supply head. Isolator switch fitted.

- Electricity provider account opened with EON (not everyone will fit a new meter). Meter installation booked for Wed 23 July.
- iii Next step.

Electrician to fit a small consumer unit (in electricity cabinet above supply head and meter); run wiring for double plug socket and defibrillator cabinet; install both with isolator switch for plug sockets inside the electricity cabinet.

- 3 NOTES / COMMENTS

i From HCC briefing - N-AK explained their separate proposal by saying

- HCC has from the beginning considered all options, taken holistic approach. The other areas arrived at the answer of four mainland unitaries as a starting point focusing only on neighbourhood (place-led) perspective.
- Structure based on existing first tier councils is responsible and cost effective.
- Setting up a new council without an existing first tier council in place risky and most importantly cost prohibitive HCC costings show leads to irrecoverable loss rather than cost savings.

ii From joint BDBC/Hart/Rushmore briefing

- ALL 15 councils were initially working together, looking first at 12, then eight options which included all possible numbers of Unitary Councils. ONLY when focus came to four mainland unitaries as the most efficient did HCC [and presumably E Hants[choose to take their own line (and became evident they had done this from the beginning).
 - [Presuming above is correct, apparently what HCC is saying isn't so much.]
- HCC use of data said to be misleading. All other councils continue to work on data –
 which shows four unitaries cost effective will release in Sept. Gov, civil servants
 will work it out.
- The options for four mainland unitaries seek to balance population and reflect local identity as best possible. Gives all areas proportionate representation to Mayor.
- Opportunities partic for the Northern Unity to create a completely new council restructuring based on best practice, and following recently proven best practice, not cling to old model which in many cases follows out-of-date practices and shown to be failing.








12 COUNCIL OPTIONS FOR ALL HANTS

NEW APPLICATIONS SINCE LAST MEETING of 16 JUNE

<u>25/00643/HOU</u> (Validated 30 Jun) Ramsdale House, Reading Road, Mattingley. Replacement windows and doors.

APPLICATIONS PENDING / RECENTLY DECIDED

- <u>25/01020/GPDFLX</u> (Pending 30 May) Thackhams Farm Bottle Lane. Application for prior approval for change of use of agricultural building to a flexible commercial use under Classes E and B8. Note requirements for permitted development regs, no external impact, eg noise, traffic.
- <u>25/00764/OHL</u> (Raise no objection 10 July, Validated 23 Apr 2025) The Leather Bottle, install a Ground Mounted Electricity Substation

'On the basis that the proposed works do constitute permitted development Hart District Council raise no objections and proposes no conditions, although using materials finished in a dark colour (dark green or black) is requested. However, the Local Planning Authority has not assessed whether the proposal is permitted development in accordance with the provisions of the General Permitted Development Order 2015 (as amended) and the applicant is reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that the works are indeed permitted development. To do so, they may choose to apply for a Certificate of Lawfulness for a Proposed Use or Development.'

- <u>25/00741/LBC</u> (Grant 09 July, Validated 08 May) The Dairy, Bottle Lane. Retention of an Electric Vehicle Charging point on the external wall of the building,
- <u>25/00646/OHL</u> (No objections <u>28 May</u>, Validated 04 Apr 2025) Hatts Cottage Hazeley Heath. Works to Underground sections of our overhead network and to relocate a pole into land designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest.
- <u>25/00477/FUL</u> (Pending, Validated 21 Mar 2025) The Mutton At Hazeley Heath. Erection of 8 units of guest accommodation with associated parking, landscaping and new Sewage Treatment Plant. Parish Council objections re parking submitted.

For info – Rotherwick application 25/00125/HOU for info – Appeal dismissed for Willow Cottage, Reading Road, Mattingley. Demolition of existing garage and erection of triple garage, study and gym, with a second study within the roof space.
