62 PUBLIC SESSION

- 1. Phone box update** All header signs and glazing installed – other than door. Door at the moment unable to close, missing a fixing plate. Work should be finished by September.
- 2. Van parking** every night up on pavement close to phone box. Barriers placed around box and these have been thrown into the hedge. Noted residents have posted requests on Facebook for the van not to park there.

65 COUNTY CLLR UPDATE

- Reports on the HCC Future Services Consultation (SP25 savings proposals) are to be considered by HCC Committee meetings in September.
- A30 project - from Hook to Blackwater at Surrey border. Financed by Central government, this is an experimental project to reduce the amount of carbon used in road repairs – thought to largely for resurfacing work. (Also included in project are sections of road in South East Hampshire and in Somerset.) It seems the the main feature of this new surface is that it can be laid at a much lower temperature.
- Noted extreme rainfall and flooding of 08 August – in particular impact on Hartley Wintney businesses.

The horse box has (at present) been moved. To advise Cllr Davies if it returns.

.3 Plough Lane – River Hart – Manure stored on field – potential pollutant to Hart. Cllr Davies raised the issue at Bramshill Parish Council AGM. Advised by Bramshill Chairman that 'this was horse manure and that it will be removed promptly and as soon as conditions permit' – reference a discussion with Bramshill Estate Manager. Noted not yet removed – also size of task.

RSBP is short of funds and undertaking reviews of all their reserves. Priority for funding will be given to those with visitor centres; will mean a lot of people redundant including Assistant Warden for Hazeley Heath. (Warden covers Farnham, Hazeley and Black Bushe.) Will mean Volunteers running the work on the Heath with no guarantees of how much responsibility they are willing to take on. Assistant Warden presently takes on Interns and looks after animals. Will know final decision in September.

.2 SID – Andy Piercy report

i Encroaching vegetation Andy has cut back majority. SID location at Leather Bottle, a larger branch also obscuring the road sign. Agreed Andy to cut back with Keith as banksman. Noted Parish Council thanks.

ii Batteries One set will soon need replacing.

.3 Councillor vacancy notice for PC noticeboards and website – **APPENDIX VI****.4 Magnolia tree by memorial bus shelter**

Background A young driver came off the road early hours of 22 July, demolished the post box and ran into a Magnolia tree which thankfully moved; the driver apparently mostly unharmed. He knocked on neighbour’s door. (Post box swiftly replaced by Royal Mail.)

The tree was pushed over against the bus shelter, but it moved from its roots; the roots are mostly still holding. The Parish Lengthman cut branches back from bus shelter which emerged unscathed. **APPENDIX VII**

The Magnolia is a specimen tree planted – as per its plaque – by the Mattingley WI in 1980 as their 50th jubilee tree. As such a question as to who is responsible for the tree; there is no longer a Mattingley WI, the nearest is now in Hartley Wintney; the tree is on Sir Anthony Milburn’s land, he has been notified and spoke of discussing with his insurance.

The Magnolia is an attractive tree, benefits its location by the war memorial bus shelter. It seems it should be recoverable but will involve righting and permanent support.

AGREED For benefit of location, iconic tree, safety of tree – to find means to right it.

Quote received of £350 - this thought to be too much; however LM hours can be used so will pay only for machinery, post and straps.

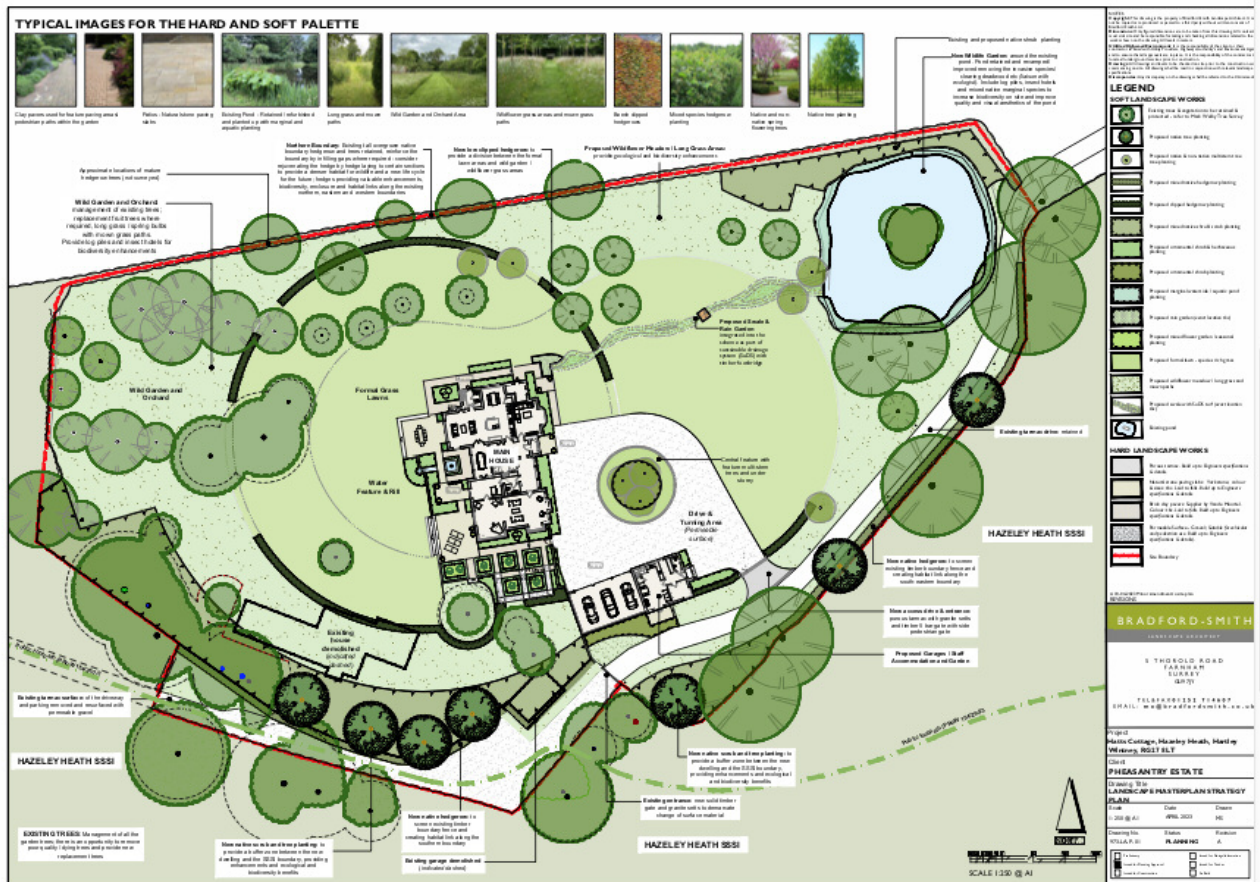

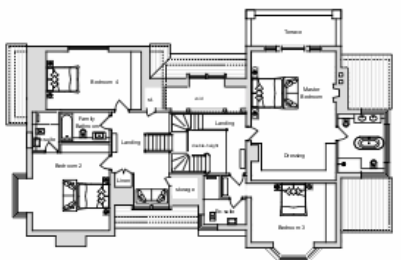
Ground Floor Plan

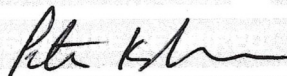

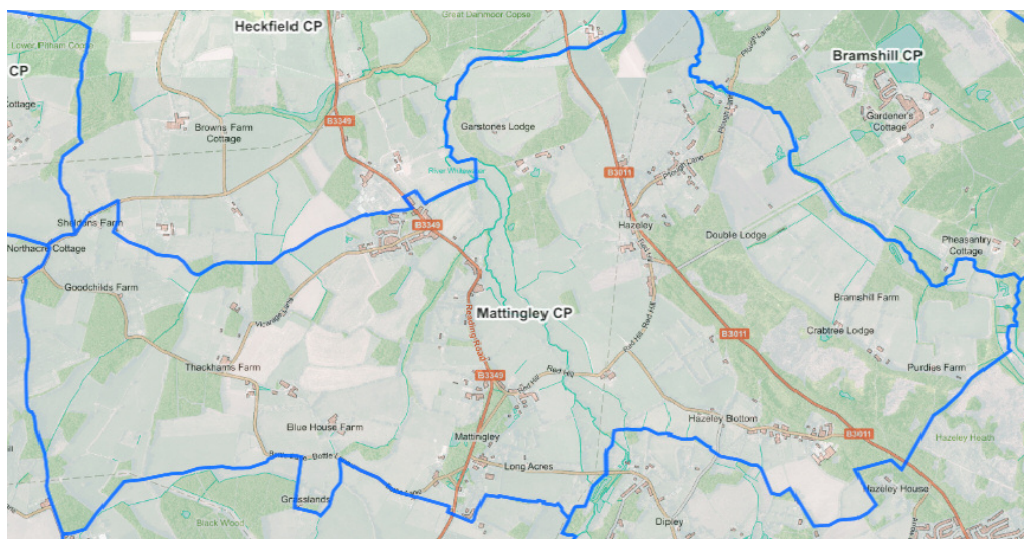
